Ms. Janice Peronto, Ed.D, Executive Director for Special Education, Killeen Independent School District (KISD), reported Killeen Independent School District will continue to ensure a free and appropriate public education for students that meet eligibility as identified by federal and state regulations.

The Special Education Representation for the past five-plus years (2016--11.0%, 2015--11.2%, 2014--11.3%, 2013--10.7%, 2012--10.6%,) fell above the 8.5% Cap, indicating that Killeen ISD students are meeting eligibility requirements and are receiving services.

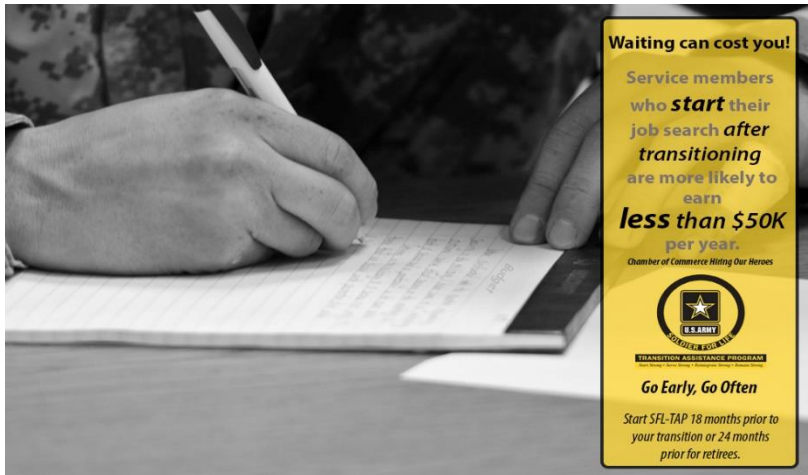
