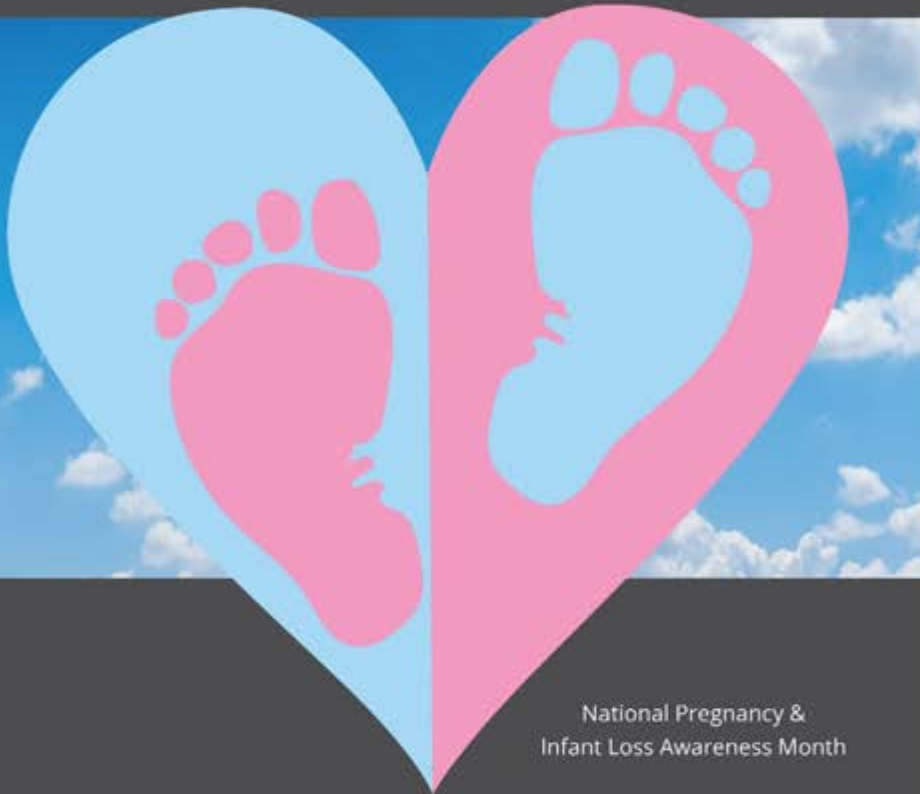

EFMP Program Basics

- EFMP is a DOD assignments management program
- EFMP enrollment is mandatory for qualifying Active Duty Family members of all ages
- EFMP enrollment is required for TRICARE ECHO eligibility for funding for certain qualified services
- Additional Family support services are available through ACS EFMP



Criteria for Enrollment

- Potentially life-threatening conditions and/or chronic medical/physical conditions requiring follow-up support more than once a year or specialty care at any frequency
- Medical equipment or a need for modified housing
- Family member who cannot be taken care of by a family physician in an isolated out-patient clinic
- Current and/or chronic mental health condition within last 5 years (duration of 6 months or longer)
- Diagnosis of asthma or chronic wheezing within last 5 years
- Treatment or school accommodations for ADD/ADHD in last year
- Ongoing Early Childhood Intervention/Special ED

When to Enroll

- EFMP enrollment should be done by PCM or specialist when diagnosis is made
- Do **NOT** wait for overseas screen as this may cause Soldier to PCS without Family
- HRC uses EFMP enrollment to determine best accompanied PCS location for Soldier/Family
- Enrollment/update/disenrollment can take 3 to 4 weeks, including appointment with provider, returning form to EFMP, send to regional center for coding

Overseas Screens for Command Sponsorship

- When Fort Hood Soldiers are considered for upcoming overseas assignment, they need DA Form 5888 authenticated by Family Travel
- Soldier prints authenticated DA 5888 after entering Family info into online levy brief
- The Family will make their appointments for Overseas Screen through Central Appointments at 288-8888
- The Family should not delay the Overseas Screen in case enrollable conditions are identified and the Family is denied for the proposed location

Deployment Lessons Learned

- When EFMP expires during deployment, Soldiers are delayed receiving follow-on assignments
- Qualified Family members who are not enrolled may be missing out on available support services
- The Soldier does not need to be present for Family members to enroll or update
- Family members can complete Overseas Screen for upcoming assignment while Soldier is deployed. Screening is good for twelve months and can be repeated closer to PCS

FRG FUNDRAISING OPPORTUNITIES AT THE FORT HOOD AREA THRIFT SHOP



Earn Up To \$200 for your FRG!

A minimum of one person and a maximum of five people may volunteer to work each shift in its entirety. The work shifts are Tuesdays -Thursdays from 0845 to 1415 and Saturdays 0845 to 1315. Volunteers will be contracted to complete from 5 up to 20 hours of volunteer service in a 1 month period.

FRG Volunteers must arrive by 0845 for a briefing by the Manager or Assistant Manager unless they have prior volunteer experience at the Thrift Shop.

The duties are to include, but are not limited to pulling expired items, emptying the donation bin, tagging items, straightening merchandise and miscellaneous tasks. A 30 minute lunch break is included in the day as scheduled by the manager. Volunteers are responsible for their own lunch.

No childcare is provided, and no children under the age of 16 should be brought to the Thrift Shop by volunteers.

The FRG representative who signed the contract may pick up the check at the Thrift Shop on the 1st business day of the month following the contact period.

ALL FRGs must get approval through their Command and MWR prior to entering into a contract with the Fort Hood Area Thrift Shop.

Program right here at
The Great Place

(and for Texas Guard and Reserve Soldiers)

- Soldiers may begin working with counselors to prepare applications
- During this Limited User Test (LUT) which includes only Fort Hood Soldiers and Guard & Reserve in Texas, Soldiers must choose from 28 approved credentials
- Unlike TA, CA covers books, fees, etc.
- Soldiers can use up to \$4,000 of CA annually
- During this test, Officers who use CA will *NOT incur an ADSO*
- We encourage you to see a counselor soon to get your questions answered and guidance on preparing your CA application packet

Stamp of excellence: No matter what career you pursue, certifications/ credentials tell your employer and co-workers that you are qualified.

Helps you get hired: Employers looking to hire want you to have knowledge, experience *and* certifications in your areas of expertise.

Earn more money: Certifications don't just separate job candidates starting out; they also demonstrate that you're committed to your profession and are willing to invest in your future. That's why employers are more likely to invest in you if you hold a certification / credential.

Keep current: One of the most important reasons to get certified is that it helps you stay ahead of the competition. If you truly want to succeed in your career, you need to stay current in all the technologies and regulations that affect your profession. Always keep learning and you'll have a knowledge base that will make you an asset to your employer far into the future.

May be mandatory by law for some careers: Federal, state, or local law may require specific credentials to legally perform some jobs.

Enhance Military career: Civilian credentialing can contribute to your military career development, and may be accepted for self-development requirements and included in performance evaluations.

Compete with civilian counterparts: Credentialed Services members demonstrate to prospective civilian employers that their skills are on par with their civilian peers.
