EXPLANATION/ DISCUSSION: Gate Hours at Santa Fe Gate (ACP6)

ACP6 is closed on training holidays and Darnall is open. There is a significant increase in time to get o n or off the installation during peak hours for both staff and patients.

PROPOSED RECOMMENDATION:

Adjust gate hours. Close earlier daily and remain open on training holidays. Recommend gate open M-F, 0600-1830.

RESPONSE

Historical traffic throughput at Santa Fe Gate has made this a limited access gate with limited hours. The gate is located in close proximity to ACP 1 (Bernie Beck Gate) which is open 24/7. **Utilizing Bernie Beck Gate** to on training holidays to access CRDAMC makes for an added drive time of only 2-3 additional minutes.

RESPONSE (Continued...)

Additionally, ACP 3 (Clear **Creek Gate) offers another** avenue to quickly access **Darnall Hospital.** The **CRDAMC DASG operate** Santa Fe Gate on Training Holidays for outbound only traffic during evening egress to ease traffic congestion.

Clark Road Gate is backed up at certain times during morning and afternoon.

EXPLANATION/ DISCUSSION:

ACP 14 (Old Copperas Cove RD Gate) has historically experienced low traffic throughput volume. Low traffic throughput and the Senior **Commander's intent to** reduce Borrowed Military Manpower (BMM), where possible, resulted in the closure of this gate. It is not anticipated that this ACP will reopen.






