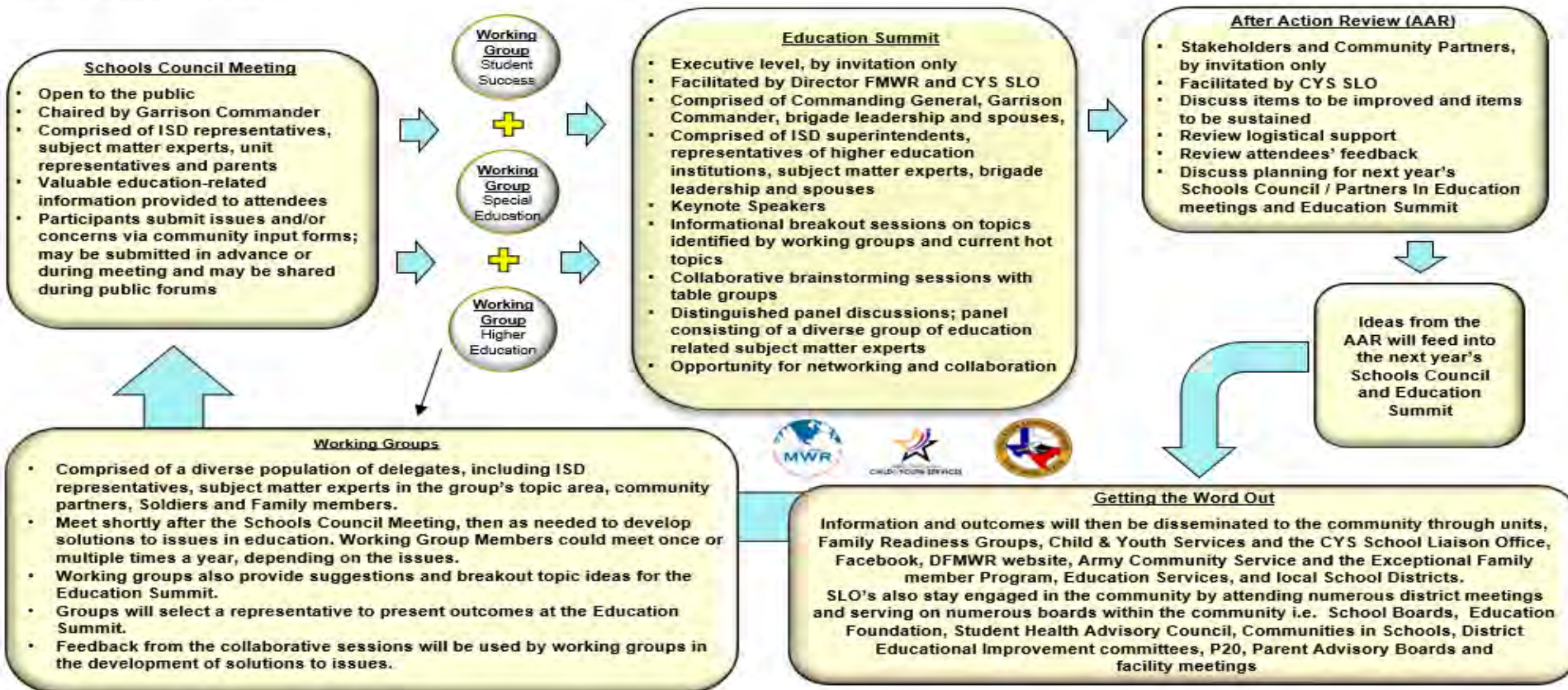

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What Is AP?

An overview

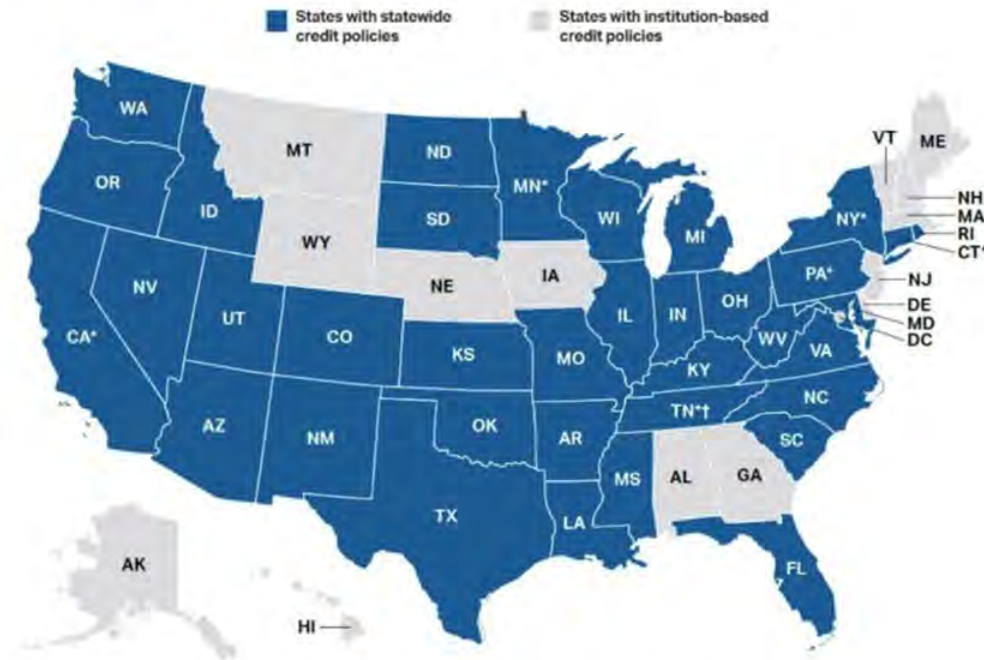
- The Advanced Placement® Program (AP®) enables willing and academically prepared students to pursue college-level studies while still in high school.
- The program consists of college-level courses developed by the AP Program that high schools can choose to offer and corresponding exams that are administered once a year.

AP Credit Policies

- 36 states have some type of AP credit policy.

AP Classroom offers Standardization and Support

Key Features



Unit Guides provide an outline of the exact content and skills covered on the AP Exam and include Topic Pages, which describe the content for each topic.



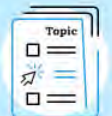
Progress Checks assess student understanding of topics and skill within a unit through multiple-choice and free-response questions.



AP Daily is a series of on-demand, short videos that teachers can assign to students*, saving direct class time to focus on areas where students need the most support.



The **My Reports** section can help teachers visualize student progress and prioritize areas for extra support by pinpointing strengths and weaknesses.



Topic Questions are formative questions that teachers can use to check student understanding of content and skills as each topic is taught.



The **Question Bank** is a searchable database of real AP questions that teachers can use to create customized practice, online or on paper.

*AP Daily videos are always visible and available to all students, including students in Exam Only sections, regardless of whether teachers have assigned them. Topic Questions, Progress Checks, and Question Bank assessments are only visible to students if a teacher assigns them.

- 1 Build connections for students between **college and career** interests.
- 2 Teach students to **perform key career-relevant tasks and skills** through project-based learning.
- 3 Provide frameworks aligned with **postsecondary and employer-endorsed standards**.
- 4 Engage **employers alongside educators** to validate and score AP Exams so that students can earn college credit as well as an employer-endorsed credential.

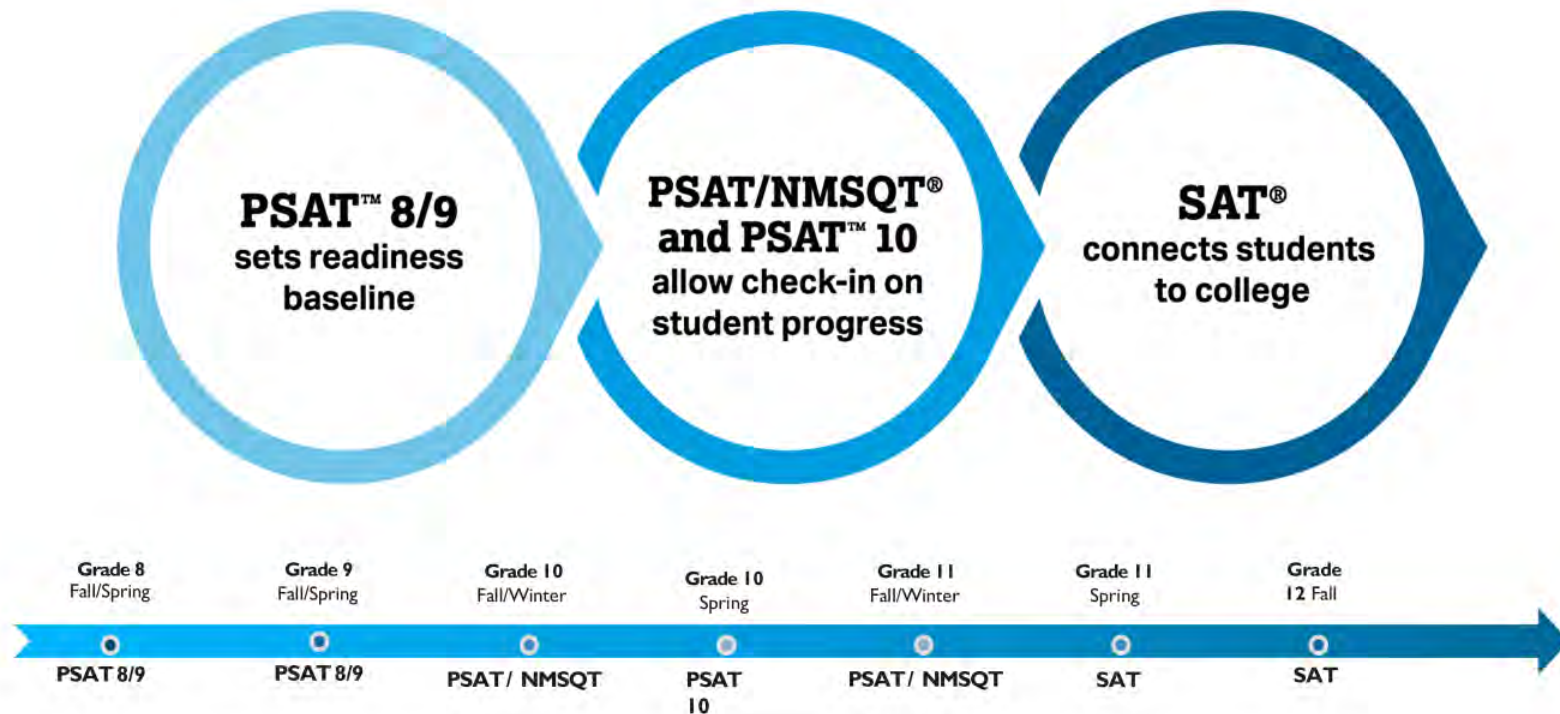

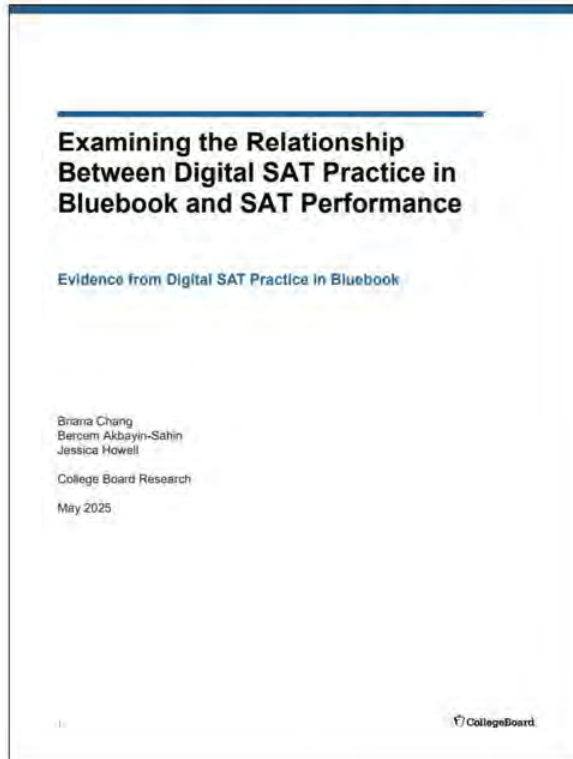

New Research on Digital SAT Practice



Research Question

What is the relationship between completing full-length digital SAT practice tests on Bluebook and SAT scores?

Data & Methods

- Sample of nearly 150,000 SAT School Day students in March 2024
- Regression models that control for student and family attributes



SAT Practice in Bluebook



Test Preview

A short set of untimed questions lets students experience digital testing and try out the tools. They won't receive scores or any feedback on their answers.



Full-Length Practice Test

Full-length practice tests are timed like a real test and include all the tools available to students on the actual tests. Students are also scored just as they would on the real thing.



How to Use Bluebook Practice Tests



Figure out which test-taking strategies work best.



Pay attention to the pacing.



Try to duplicate testing conditions.



Get to know Bluebook.

My Practice



After completing the full-length practice test, students can sign in to **My Practice** to view their results.

- View practice score results and practice exam questions, answers, and explanations.
- Access progress bars representing knowledge of all the content domains on the test.
- Use practice test scores to filter questions in the Question Bank by domain, skill, and difficulty, allowing targeted practice in areas with the most opportunity to grow.
- Generate a set of Practice Specific Questions based on practice test results to provide additional review in the areas with the greatest opportunities for improvement.

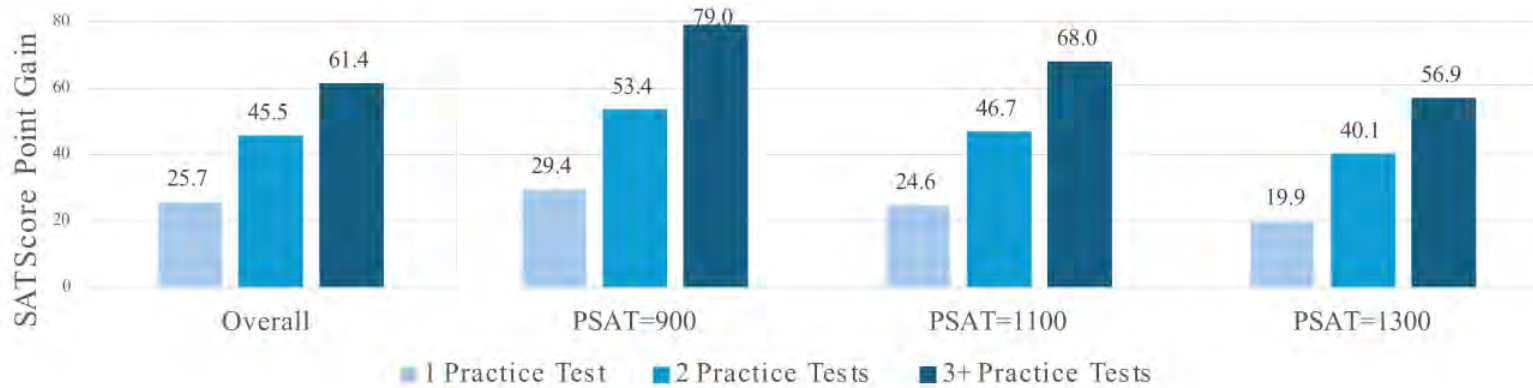

Full-Length SAT Practice Tests in Bluebook Associated with Higher SAT Scores



Completing full-length digital SAT practice tests in Bluebook associated with higher SAT scores

Students who completed 1, 2, or 3+ full-length practice tests, scored 25, 45 and 60 points higher, respectively, than similar SAT takers who did not complete any full-length digital practice tests in Bluebook

Larger SAT score gains for students with lower PSAT scores

Students with lower PSAT scores experienced the largest SAT score improvements from completing practice tests

SAT score gains observed across all demographic groups

Students from all backgrounds realize positive gains from completing full-length digital practice tests in Bluebook

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School Behavioral Health

Available at on-post middle and elementary schools

- ✓ Providers are embedded within the school
- ✓ Easily accessible for students and families
- ✓ Decreases burden on Families to find services
- ✓ Work collaboratively with all school staff
- ✓ Reduces absences from school
- ✓ Services in the school, where children spend a majority of their day
- ✓ Increases prevention/early intervention and wellness
- ✓ Medical appointment
 - ✓ Documented in child's medical record
 - ✓ Protected health information



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School Behavioral Health

CHILD/STUDENT LEVEL - decreased absences, improved grades, fewer behavior problems, emotionally healthy

FAMILY LEVEL - increased cohesion and family functioning, Soldier readiness

SCHOOL LEVEL - decreased behavioral incidents, improved climate, better performance

COMMUNITY LEVEL - increased partnerships with other child/youth serving agencies

SYSTEM LEVEL - Develop Resilience and Support Unit Readiness
