TOPIC 1: Recycle

- **Explanation/Discussion:** Currently the Fort Hood Recycle Center has an issue with their garbage trucks being out of service, as a result, garbage isn't being picked up regularly and is accumulating.
- **Proposed Recommendation:** Fort Hood initiative to provide garbage bags for units and give each unit a drop off time to assist with the garbage issue.
- **Response:** Thank you for your recommendation. While Fort Hood Recycle does not recommend trash bags, we do have collection bins available (photo shown), that units may pick up to collect recycle materials and drop off at the Recycle Center.

BLUE CARD UPDATES

TOPIC 2: Finance

- **Explanation/Discussion:** I have soldiers who are not getting bonuses and pay due to them per regulation. They are not doing their job, Making excuses, communication is poor. Soldiers is not getting paid for years.
- **Proposed Recommendation:** NEW SOP, SYNC on regulations
- **Response:** Enlistment Bonuses are currently paid to the Soldier after completion of AIT. Soldier must submit a claim for payment at their first duty station through their S-1. Upon receipt finance has five business days to process.

Reenlistment bonuses – are paid to soldiers as incentives to remain on active duty. Bonuses are processed by the Retention NCO with direct input in to the payroll system. Finance does not have visibility of the RETAINS process.

We stand waiting to assist with resolving any and all pay issues when provided names and SSANs of Affected Soldiers.

Back to School Safety

Traffic Signals & Crossing Guards



- Never cross the street against a red light, even if you don't see any traffic coming. Wear reflective clothing and bright colors so drivers can see you easier.
- Plan a safe walking route to school or the bus stop. Choose the most direct way with the fewest street crossings and if possible, with intersections that have traffic controls.
- Advise children to arrive early for buses, stay out of the street, and to wait for the bus to come to a complete stop before approaching the street.



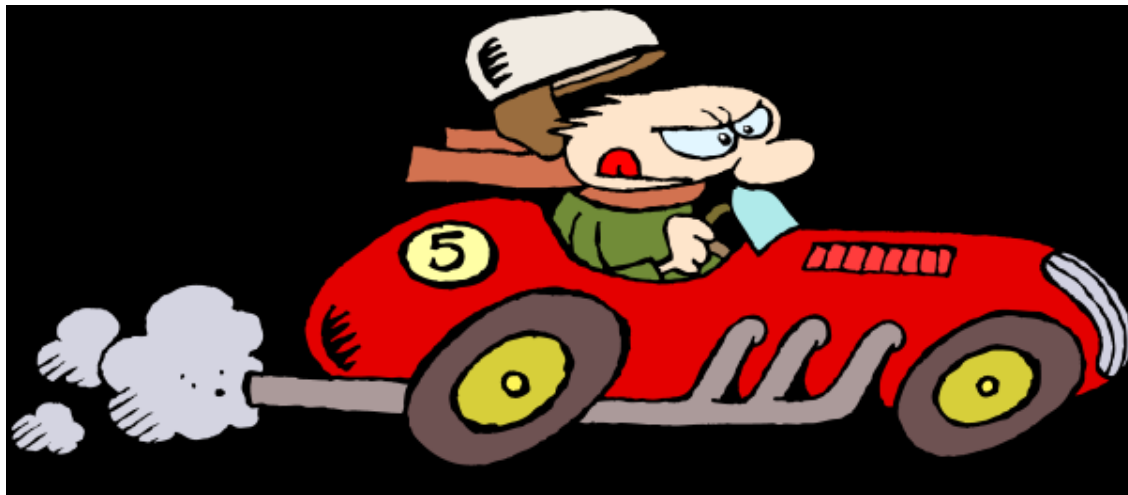

Back to School Safety

Tips for Drivers

- Be watchful around schools and bus stops for children running into the street.
- Watch for children entering the street from behind buses or running to catch the bus.
- Deliver and pick your children up as close to the school as possible. Don't leave until they are safely on school grounds.
- Drive slowly when approaching children riding bicycles and walking near the street.
- Watch your speed when entering school zones.

Back to School Safety **Children Supervision**

Fort Hood Regulation 420-37 (Housing Regulation) states- Children **10 years-old and under** (or 11 years old if in the 5th grade) will have direct supervision (that is, line of sight) by a(n):

- **Adult; Parent;** Child, Youth & School Services (CYSS) site staff.
- Designated “responsible” teenager who is **at least 13 years old**.
- Children 12 years old (or 11 years old if in the 6th grade) will have **monitored supervision**.
- Parents may designate an **adult neighbor** with whom the child may “**physically**” check-in with at intervals.
- Parents must ensure that the child is **capable** and **knowledgeable** in handling emergency situations.
- Children 12 years old (or 11 years old if in the 6th grade) may be left unattended for **no more than 6 hours**, between the hours of 0600 to 2100, **during a 24-hour period**. Additionally, this age group may sign themselves in/out of a youth center for no more than 6 hours per day during youth center operating hours.

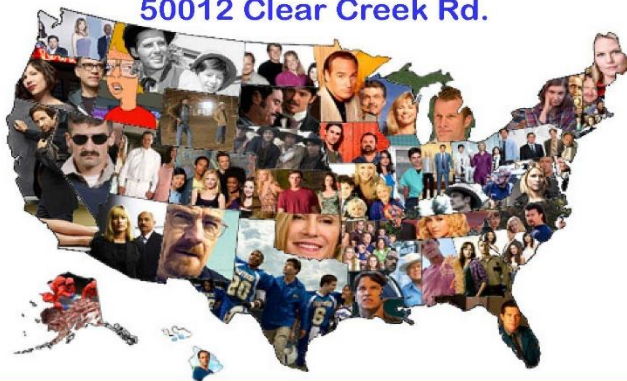

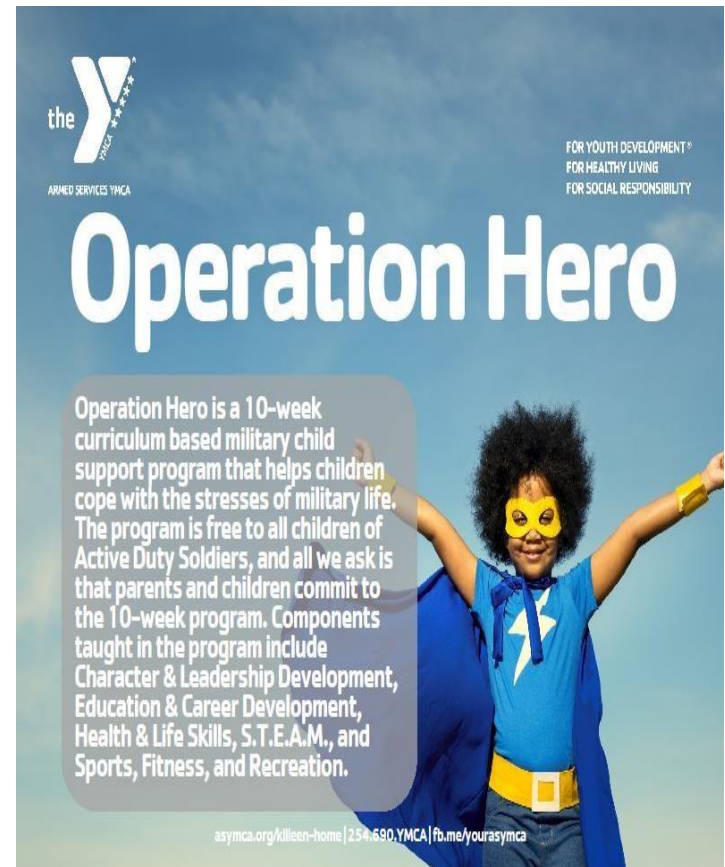

PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY: Applicants must be Active Duty E4 or below (dependents may not complete the application unless their service member is currently deployed) Family members must travel with their service member, unless he/she is deployed at the time of travel To apply through ASYMCA Killeen applicants must be stationed at Fort Hood (if you're located at another installation please contact your local ASYMCA for details) Command approved with financial need.

OPERATION HOLIDAY JOY Helping make the holidays brighter for military families Operation Holiday Joy was initially established in collaboration with Woman's Day Magazine and their readers to raise awareness and funds for military service members and their families during the holidays.

Since 2004, Operation Holiday Joy has donated more than \$1.3 million for military members and their families. 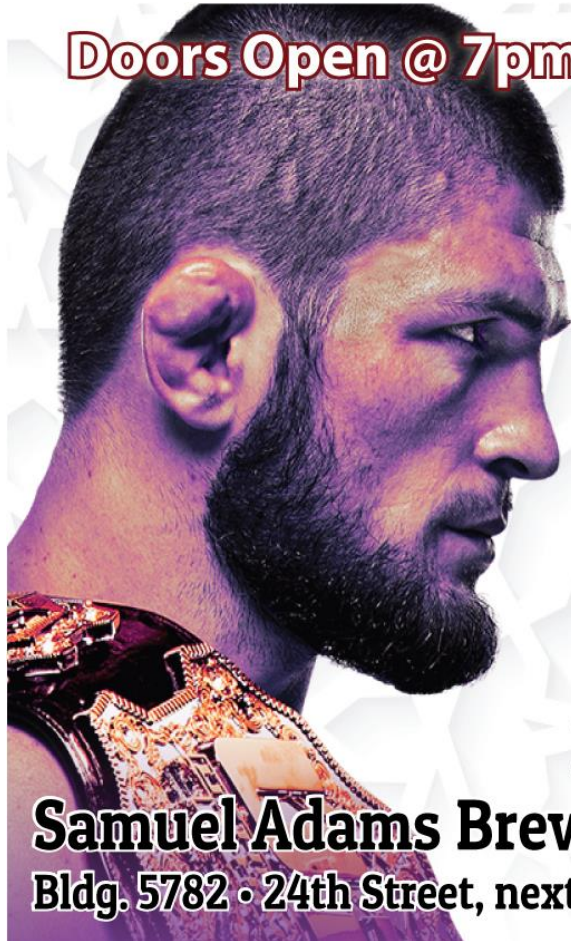

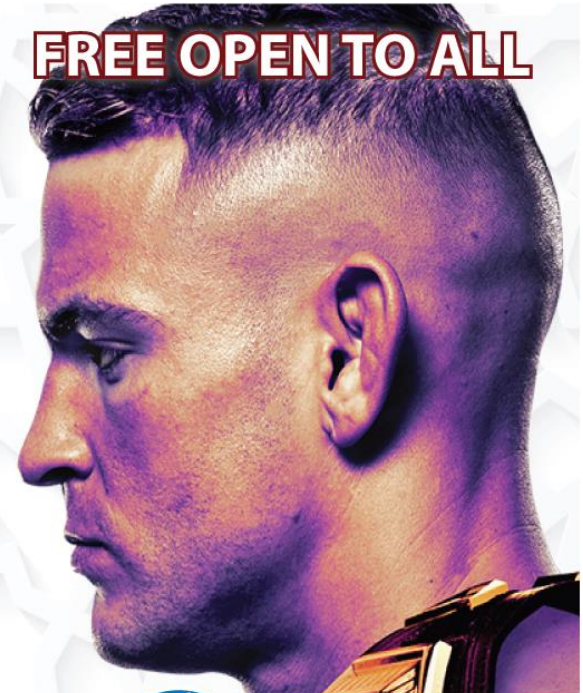
