

Children's Waiting Room (CWR) Guidelines

- The Armed Services YMCA does not administer medication
- Maximum time allowed per appointment, per child: 2 hours
- · Please bring infants/babies in clean diapers and have toilet-trained children use restroom prior to appointment
- Do we have your permission to change diapers/take child(/ren) to the restroom? Y or N
- . No food is permitted in Children's Waiting Room, with the exception of breastmilk and formula.

Per our new policy in cooperation with guidelines from the Department of Defense, we require immunization records for every child utilizing CWR. Records may be hand-delivered or scanned to awiggins@asymca.org, but we must have them on file prior to your scheduled appointment. All immunization records are required to have parent's name, child's name, and child's DOB.

ASYMCA staff do not discipline children, only attempt to redirect. If a child is unable to be redirected or harms another child, we will contact the parents for pick-up.

ASYMCA staff are unable to provide one-on-one care. If a child requires one-on-one care, or is crying/inconsolable for 15 minutes after drop-off, we will contact the parents for pick-up.

We extend a 10-minute grace period for late drop-offs. If you know you are going to be late or can't make it, please call us as early as possible so that we can either hold your spot beyond the grace period, or record the cancellation. If more than 10 minutes pass with no contact from the parent, it will be recorded as a no-show, 2 no-shows result in revocation of your ability to schedule CWR appointments in advance, and you will have to do walk-ins, which are limited capacity and first-come, first-served. We extend a 10-minute grace period for late pick-ups. If you will be late picking up, please call us as early as possible. Failure to notify staff of late pick-up or more than 2 late pick-ups can result in total suspension from the program.

Program Authority

 Public Law 79-658 authorized health services for Federal employees. Services are provided to promote the physical and mental fitness of Federal employees.



 Public Laws 96-180 and 96-181 authorized Federal agencies to provide short-term counseling to employees and their family members who have substance abuse problems.





Program Authority

- <u>Public Law 99-570, requires</u> Federal agencies to establish appropriate prevention, treatment, and rehabilitative programs and services for alcohol and drug abuse problems for civilian employees.
- Executive Order 12564 requires Federal agencies to establish Drug-Free Federal workplace programs, including an Employee Assistance Program (EAP) as an essential element in achieving a drug-free workforce. Agencies must refer all employees found to be using illegal drugs to the EAP for assessment, counseling, and referral for treatment or rehabilitation.

Key Points

- DA recognizes alcoholism and drug addiction are preventable and treatable progressive diseases.
- DA civilian employees, military and civilian employees' family members, and military retirees and their family members will have access to a confidential Employee Assistance Program.
- Civilian employees have the option of participating in either the installation ASAP clinical program (if resources are available) or being referred to an approved program in the civilian community.
- Civilian employees' absences (during work hours) to obtain treatment will be in accordance with the applicable civilian personnel regulations.
